Dr. Antonio Bullon, Mental Health Professional

Based in Massachusetts, Dr. Antonio Bullon is the medical director of the geriatric and neuropsychiatry treatment unit at the MetroWest Medical Center in Natick, where he leads a team of professionals working with patients suffering from neurodegenerative disorders. Dr. Antonio Bullon is also an assistant professor of psychiatry at Harvard Medical School, where he works with the global mental health initiative through the Department of Global Health and Social Medicine.

Dr. Bullon is also a volunteer psychiatrist for the Comision de Salud Mental (COSMA) in Ayacucho, Peru. He visits for two weeks every six months to assist with the planning and implementation of community-based mental health programs serving victims of political violence and terrorism in the Andes.

Dr. Antonio Bullon studied medicine at the Universidad Nacional Mayor de San Marcos Medical School in Peru before interning in internal medicine at Cook County Hospital in Chicago, Illinois, where he also completed a residency in internal medicine and primary care. Additionally, he completed a residency in psychiatry through the Harvard Longwood Psychiatry Residency Training Program and was chief resident of inpatient psychiatric service at the Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in his final year of training.
