Cory Countryman soon accepted an offer to become the chief operating officer of IASIS Healthcare's North Vista Hospital in Las Vegas, where he cut total expenses by over 20 percent and oversaw a \$9.5 million expansion of existing facilities.

Cory Countryman currently works as the chief executive officer of the 100-bed Walnut Hill Medical Center in Dallas, Texas. As CEO of this proprietary, stand-alone acute care hospital, Mr. Countryman was responsible for establishing every operational aspect of the facility to include personnel, equipment, supply decisions, processes and procedures and much more. The facility opened in April 2014 and has seen incredible growth, national awards, hosted international live streaming courses, and has been written about by national publications for its successes. The first full year of operations provided over \$86million in net revenues and over 200 open heart procedures.

An active member of the community, Mr. Countryman serves on the board of directors of a number of local organizations. These include the United Way and the chambers of commerce for both Weatherford and East Parker County. He also belongs to the Lions Club and the American Legion.
